## **CRPD** administrator to retire May 31

Carmichael Recreation and Park District Administrator Jack Harrison will be retiring – again – on the last day of this month.

Harrison, 70, who retired from the state in 2000, continued to work for another 13 years, during which time he bachelor's degree in parks and became the district's administrator.
